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What's New in Prezi:

- Presentation path thumbnails – easily see and edit your presentation path
- Plus button – quickly add new frames for content to your Prezi
- Shapes, background drawings, & templates – tools to organize your Prezi

Pros

- Dynamic presentations help to keep audience attention
- Presentations are online and work on all kinds of computers
- You control what you show – you don't need to use the path
- Great for displaying text, especially to zoom on important sections
- Share and collaborate by inviting others to view or edit your presentations online

Cons

- There's a fine line between "dynamic" and "dizzying"
- Requires the internet, at least for free accounts
- Does not offer as many tools as PowerPoint
- Cannot easily add sound - you'll need additional tools to create a Prezi with narration
