History

The Chicago-Kent Bulletin was begun in June of 1916 by faculty member Edward J. Veasey, Jr. It was intended to be a monthly publication, described in the 1917 edition of *The Transcript* as "a medium whereby the events which transpire within the school, worthy of mention may come to light." Issues of the *Bulletin* include sections describing the activities of each enrolled class and an alumni section. Issues include an editorial, poetry, humor, photos of faculty members, and cartoons.

The 1917 edition of *The Transcript* credits O.G. Young ('18) as business manager and editorial writer, O.B. Durand ('18) as Chief of Staff, H.E. Taylor ('18) as poetry contributor, editor of humor section, and alumni section writer.

Scope and Contents

The entire collection includes 10 issues and spans the years of 1916-1917. The March 1917 issue is mislabeled "Volume 1, No. 8" but is actually No. 9.

Restrictions

Issues are brittle and should be handled with care.

Separations

Issues were bound with string in a cloth and paper binder manufactured by The Barrett Bindery Company, labeled "Real Estate News." Binder was removed and discarded due to deterioration. A copy of the first issue of the *Chicago-Kent Review*, 1923 (which would become the *Chicago-Kent Law Review*) was included in the back of the binder, this item was removed and placed with the *Chicago-Kent Law Review* collection.

The collection is arranged into 1 series:
