Upcoming Career Planning and Placement Programs

1) **Resume Writing Workshops** have been scheduled to provide you with basic information to formulate your legal resume. You must attend one of these workshops before scheduling an individual resume counseling session. Workshops will be held on Tuesday, January 26, at 11:45 a.m. and at 5:00 p.m. Each session will be held in Room 203 and will last for about one hour.
